Who can vote: Anyone who is:

- 1. A citizen of the United States
- 2. At least 18 years of age
- 3. A resident of the North Babylon School District for a period of 30 days preceding the election

Who is registered: All persons who were registered for and who voted in any North Babylon School District or Library election within four years prior to April 8, 2025 are eligible to vote in this election. Any district resident who is qualified to vote in general elections and who remains qualified to vote from the residence address from which s/he registered and who has voted in a general election within the last four years is qualified to vote in the library election.

Annual Budget Vote and Trustee Election: Tuesday, April 8 12:00 Noon - 8:00 PM In the Library

From Your Board of Trustees

Your Board has assembled a 2025/2026 budget which requests your approval of an increase of 2%. We remain within the NYS tax cap.

Our expansion project is close to complete. This project addressed Americans with Disabilities Act issues. This included a ground floor accessible auditorium, ground floor accessible bathrooms and an elevator/lift to the stacks. As we have stated, there was no bond issue for this expansion and there is no request for additional funding. We do not think a project of this magnitude has ever been attempted on Long Island without securing a bond. We have been notified of a successful grant application totaling \$300,000 from the NYS Library Construction Aid program. This was the highest funded 2024 application in Suffolk County. We are also expecting \$50,000 courtesy of Senator Monica Martinez. Last year, our Senator procured a \$25,000 grant which was earmarked for the expansion project.

Our library is extraordinarily careful with your money and our annual audits support that statement.

Locally, circulation of traditional print materials continues to decrease, but circulation of electronic checkouts have skyrocketed as have their fees. It's easy to use these new electronic Libby formats. If you need assistance, see our librarians. They will teach you everything you need to know.

We are now fully certified by the Sustainability Library Initiative: Environmentally Sound, Socially Equitable and Economically Feasible. We want you to recognize the importance of this certification and we sincerely hope that our success will foster further community sustainability endeavors. The most effective way to address waste is to generate less in the first place.

We believe that the budget is worthy of your support

If you agree with our plan, we urge you to come down on April 8th and demonstrate your commitment.
